East Timor 1999 – Commencement of the operation of INTERFET

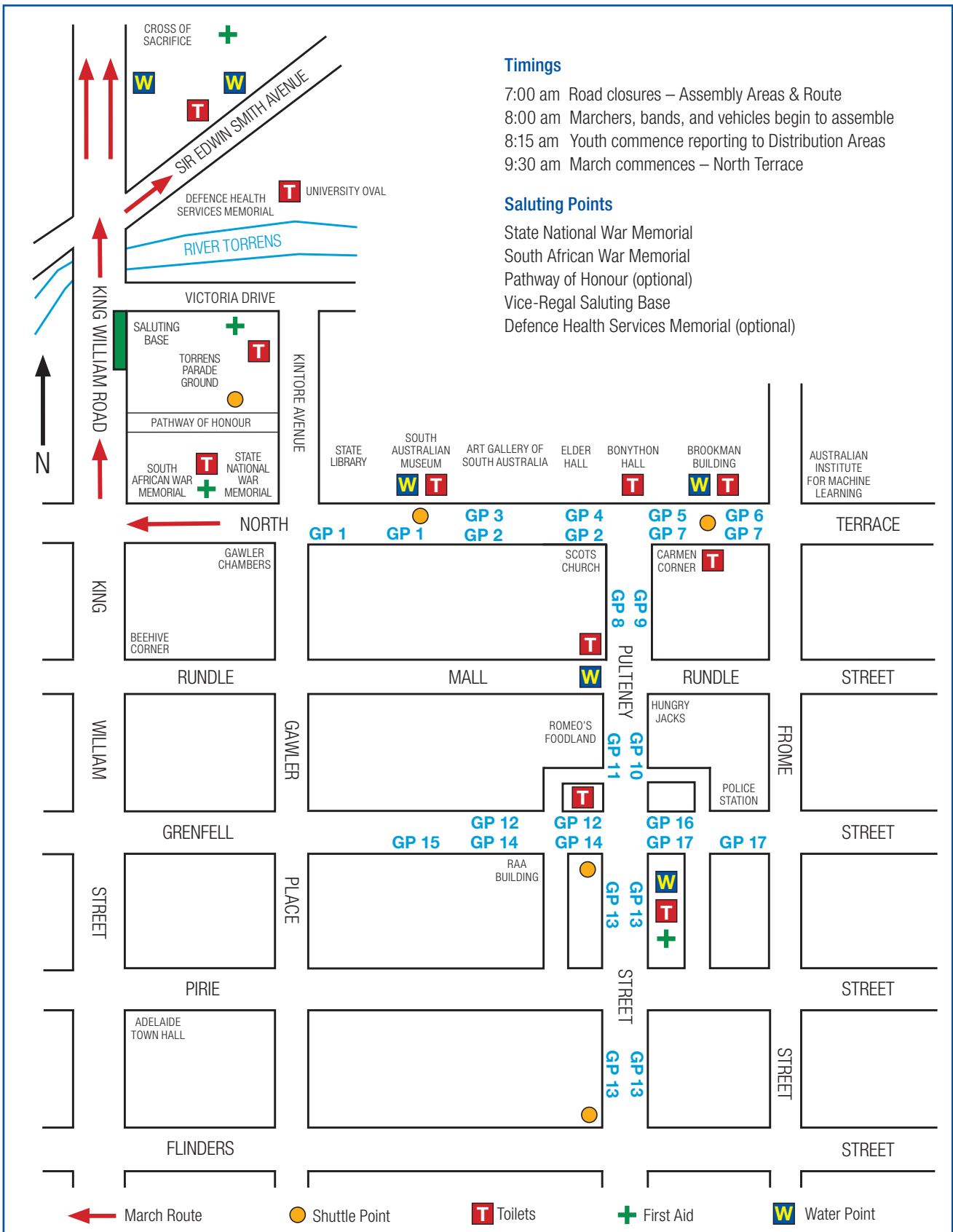
Corporal Andrew Barham, 33 years, of Brisbane, Queensland, stops for a chat with one of the children who has returned to the devastated town of Suai. Corporal Barham was an Information Specialist attached to the 3rd Brigade, normally based in Townsville. His job was to let the locals know that International Force East Timor (INTERFET) was providing security so that they could safely return to their homes and begin to rebuild.

In September 1999, the multinational INTERFET peacemaking force deployed to address the security and humanitarian crisis that had engulfed East Timor. 2024 marks the 25th anniversary of that deployment. INTERFET ran until February 2000 when it was replaced with a United Nations peacekeeping mission, UNTAET. 5,500 Australians and 1,200 New Zealanders served with INTERFET, and it was commanded by an Australian, then Major General Peter Cosgrove. Thousands more Australians and New Zealanders served with UNTAET and its successor missions, especially the International Stabilisation Force from 2006 to 2013. Five Australian Defence Force members died as a result of peace operations in East Timor.

ANZAC ON TORRENS AT TORRENS TRAINING DEPOT

On Anzac Day, the RSL is hosting **Anzac on Torrens** – a comradeship event for veterans, their families, supporters, and the general public, on Torrens Parade Ground.

Catching-up with old mates, and making new ones, is an integral part of Anzac Day – and **Anzac on Torrens** is a way for those attending and participating in commemorative events, in the city of Adelaide, to do that over food and drink.

Straight after the Dawn Service

The event will begin with a traditional gunfire breakfast for purchase, provided by Adelaide Lions, kicking-off straight after the State Dawn Service concludes around 7:00 am. Breakfast will consist of bacon and egg rolls and a cup of tea or brewed coffee. You will even have the option of adding a tot of rum to your coffee for the authentic gunfire taste!

Once people have had something to eat and drink, we encourage you to participate in the Anzac Day gathering at the north-western corner of the parade ground – or attend the Light Horse Memorial, at the intersection of North & East Terraces, Adelaide. Both of these commemorative services commence at 8:00 am.

The Anzac Day March commences at 9:30 am, and from 10:00 am **Anzac on Torrens** will really kick-off.

Lunchtime and into the Afternoon

Adelaide Lions will be providing a barbeque lunch for purchase – and a choice of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks will be available from marquees staffed by the State RSL, Legacy, and the Combined Ex-Services Mess.

A traditional Two-up ring will be in operation to add to the atmosphere.

There will be shelter and chairs on the parade ground, and Coast FM 88.7 will conduct a live broadcast from the event for the first time.

The Legacy Café inside the Drill Hall

The Legacy Club of South Australia will operate a seated café, inside the northern end of the Drill Hall, for hot drinks and sweet treats – and will also include a children's activity area.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR ANZAC DAY

PERSONS ELIGIBLE TO MARCH

Veterans, Serving Members, and Ex-Service personnel who have served in the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia – and of any other country, which, at the time of rendering such service, was an ally of Australia – may participate in the March.

Relatives are actively encouraged to assist older veterans by carrying ship, unit, or squadron flags & banners – but are not to march within the veterans' ranks, unless they are acting as the veteran's carer.

A carer is permitted to assist any veteran requiring assistance to march, or to be pushed in a wheelchair.

Descendants of The Fallen, of deceased veterans, and those representing veterans who are unable to march, are welcome to participate in the March.

All descendants who participate in the March must be **at least 12 years of age**, dressed in a dignified manner, and (unless they are a veteran's carer) march in one of 33 specially-provided Descendants' sections within **Groups 15–17**.

Descendants are encouraged to wear their relative's service medals – and always on the **right** breast.

Traditional National Headdress must not be worn by Descendants.

Military Headdress must only be worn by serving and ex-service personnel.

Minimum Standard of Dress for descendants is a **collared** shirt and trousers – or female equivalent.

Coat and tie or female equivalent, is preferred.

The following items of dress are NOT permitted to be worn during the March: jeans, shorts, T-shirts, track suits, hoodies, sandals, joggers, beanies, sporting scarves, or other inappropriate items.

WORKING & REGISTERED ASSISTANCE ANIMALS

Working & Registered Assistance Animals are permitted to participate in the March.

RECOMMENDED PASSENGER DROP-POINTS

The following routes to stop & drop-points are recommended for civilian participants arriving by car, in order to minimise traffic congestion and delay.

Vehicles must depart as soon as their passengers have alighted, to allow others to do the same.

Permission has been granted by the City of Adelaide and the Department of Infrastructure & Transport, to use the following areas as passenger drop-points from 6:00 am until 11:59 pm, on Anzac Day.

If approaching from the North or East

Drive south along Frome Road (or west along North Terrace) to drop on the **eastern** side of Frome Street, between Grenfell & Pirie Streets. Then exit **south** towards Flinders Street.

If approaching from the North or West

Drive along West Terrace, then east along Franklin Street, cross over King William Street to Flinders Street, then turn **left** into Gawler Place. Continue north along Gawler Place, across Pirie Street, and turn **left** into Grenfell Street, to drop on the **southern** side of Grenfell Street – at Bus Stop U1, between Gawler Place & Exchange Place.

Then exit **west** towards King William Street, and continue west, towards West Terrace – or turn **left** to continue towards South Terrace.

It will **not** be possible to turn right, into King William Street.

If approaching from the South or East

Drive north along Pulteney Street (or east along Flinders Street) to drop on the **southern** side of Flinders Street, in the area between the Metropolitan Fire Brigade Headquarters & St Francis Xavier's Cathedral – or on the **western** side of Frome Street, between Pirie & Grenfell Streets.

Passengers must not be dropped on the western side of Frome Street, between Grenfell & Rundle Streets, as this area must be used by Police vehicles while construction works are carried out on the northern side of Grenfell Street, west of Bent Street.

If approaching from the South or West

Drive along West Terrace, then east along Franklin Street, cross over King William Street to Flinders Street, then turn **left** into Gawler Place. Continue north along Gawler Place, across Pirie Street, and **left** again, into Grenfell Street, to drop on the **southern** side of Grenfell Street – at Bus Stop U1, between Gawler Place & Exchange Place.

Then exit **west** towards King William Street, and continue west, towards West Terrace – or turn **left** to continue towards South Terrace.

It will **not** be possible to turn right, into King William Street.

SHUTTLE SERVICES & DEPARTURE POINTS

Anzac Day March participants may avail themselves of the three continuous shuttle services, which will operate from 6-seater golf buggies along North Terrace, Pulteney Street, and Kintore Avenue.

The following services will operate continuously from 8:00 am until 9:15 am:

Shuttle Route 1 (Torrens Training Depot to the South Australian Museum): departs from the southern edge of Torrens Parade Ground and moves to Kintore Avenue via the Adelaide Rifles' Pathway, and then turns **left** into North Terrace, to a point in front of the South Australian Museum.

This service then returns to the southern edge of Torrens Parade Ground, via the reverse route.

Shuttle Route 2 (Flinders Street to the South Australian Museum): departs from the western corner of Flinders & Pulteney Streets and moves north along Pulteney Street, calls at the south-western corner of Grenfell & Pulteney Streets, continues north, then turns **left** into North Terrace, to move west to a point in front of the South Australian Museum.

This service then returns to Flinders Street, via the reverse route.

Shuttle Route 3 (University tram stop to the South Australian Museum): departs from the eastern end of the University tram stop on North Terrace, then moves west along North Terrace to the South Australian Museum.

This service then returns to King William Street, via the reverse route.

The driver responsible for this route may also be redirected to assist along Routes 1 or 2, if required.

Shuttle Service Departure Points will be serviced from 8:00 am until 9:15 am, at the following locations:

Torrens: at the south-eastern corner of Torrens Parade Ground, at the bottom of Adelaide Rifles' Pathway.

Museum: on the northern side of North Terrace, on the roadway in front of the South Australian Museum.

University: at the eastern end of the northern platform of the University tram stop.

Hindmarsh: near the north-eastern corner of the south-western quadrant of Hindmarsh Square, at the junction of Grenfell & Pulteney Streets.

Flinders: on the north-western corner of Flinders & Pulteney Streets.

ST JOHN FIRST AID VEHICLES & PERSONNEL

St John Ambulance personnel will staff First Aid points at the following locations:

Northern side of North Terrace in Prince Henry Gardens, west of the State National War Memorial.

South-eastern quadrant of Hindmarsh Square between Grenfell & Pirie Streets.

Torrens Parade Ground just inside the boom gate, south of Victoria Drive.

Pennington Gardens just west of the junction of Sir Edwin Smith Avenue & War Memorial Drive (East).

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES (ASSEMBLY AREAS & ROUTE)

Permanent toilets will be available for use at the following locations:

City of Adelaide toilet in the north-western quadrant of Hindmarsh Square.

Ground floor level of UPark east of the corner of Rundle & Pulteney Streets.

Torrens Training Depot inside Torrens Hall, at either end of the drill hall proper.

Northern side of North Terrace in Prince Henry Gardens, west of the State National War Memorial.

Portable disabled toilets will be located on the northern side of North Terrace, just north of the footpath, and in line with the main door to Bonython Hall, at the University of Adelaide.

Other portable toilets will be available for use at the following locations:

5 x unisex toilets in Prince Henry Gardens, west of the Captain Matthew Flinders Memorial.

2 x unisex toilets co-located with the Museum Distribution Area.

2 x unisex toilets co-located with the Brookman Distribution Area.

2 x unisex toilets co-located with the Rundle Distribution Area.

6 x unisex toilets co-located with the Hindmarsh Distribution Area.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES (NEAR DISPERSAL AREAS)

Permanent toilets will be available for use at the following locations:

Adelaide University Oval at both ends of the rear of the grandstand.

Torrens Training Depot inside both ends of the drill hall.

Portable toilets will be available for use at the following location:

4 x unisex and 2 x disabled toilet units on the eastern side of Pennington Gardens – just west of the junction of Sir Edwin Smith Avenue & War Memorial Drive (east).

PASSENGER PICK-UP POINT – PENNINGTON TERRACE (WEST)

A Pick-Up Point has been offered on Pennington Terrace (west) by the City of Adelaide, for use after the March, in order to minimise traffic congestion and delay.

There will be no vehicular access to King William Road from Pennington Terrace, so a U-turn must be made, once passengers have been collected.

If approaching from the North

Drive **south** along Jeffcott Street, then turn **left** at Montefiore Hill to head **east** along Pennington Terrace, to collect passengers.

To exit, drive **west** along Pennington Terrace and exit via either Palmer Place or Montefiore Hill.

If approaching from the South

Drive **north** along Montefiore Road, then turn **right** at Montefiore Hill to head **east** along Pennington Terrace.
